

## REGULATIONS FOR THE PREPARATION OF DOGS FOR EXHIBITION F (ANNEXE B)

1. These regulations must be observed when a dog is prepared for exhibition at any Kennel Club Licensed event. Objections may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under these Show Regulations and/or for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rule A42.
  - (a) A dog found to have been exhibited in breach of these Regulations will automatically be disqualified from exhibition at the show and from any award gained thereat.
  - (b) Unless the exhibitor provides a satisfactory explanation for the dog being exhibited in breach of these Regulations then he/she may be subject to further penalties of either a fine or as listed under Rule A42
2. (a) No substance, which alters the natural colour, texture or body of the coat, may be present in the dog's coat for any purpose at any time during the show. No substance, which alters the natural colour of any external part of the dog may be present on the dog for any purpose at any time during the show.
3. No act of operation which alters the natural confirmation of a dog or any part thereof may be performed except:-
  - (a) Operations certified to the satisfaction of the General Committee
  - (b) The removal of dew claws of any breed
  - (c) The shortening of tails of customarily docked breeds but only up to an acceptable age limit, which shall be prescribed from time to time.
  - (d) Operations to prevent breeding provided that such operations are notified to the Kennel Club before neutered dogs are shown.Nor must anything be done calculated to in the opinion of the General Committee to deceive.
4. The General Committee without previous notice may order examination of any dog or dogs at any show. Any examination thus ordered will be made by a person having executive authority who shall have a written directive from the Kennel Club in their possession. Samples may be taken for further examination and analysis.
5. An individual has the right to lodge an objection to a dog only if he/she is the owner or handler of the dog competing in the same breed or class. An objection may however, be lodged by an official of the Show or by anyone so deputed by the Kennel Club. It will be the responsibility of the individual who lodges the objection. The Kennel Club will substantiate the grounds for an objection made on its behalf.
6. Any objection by any individual related to an infringement of these Regulations must be made in writing to the show Secretary at his/her office before the close of the Show and the individual must produce evidence of identity at the time of lodging the complaint.

## SHOW REGULATIONS CONT....

#### Withdrawal from other Competition.

Dogs which become eligible for Best in Show maybe withdrawn from all other competition, other than Breed Classes, prior to the Competition for Best Puppy in Show as appropriate in order to remain unbeaten A dog beaten in competition for Best in Show may subsequently be exhibited in all competition for which it was previously eligible. The dog declared Best in Show and Reserve Best in Show, however, must not compete in any subsequent competition.

#### Proviso

For the purpose of this Regulation, dogs beaten in competition for Stud Dog, Brood Bitch, Progeny, Brace and Team or a Special Award confined to one breed will not be considered to be a beaten dog.

13. Exhibits will not be admitted to Best in Show competition after a period of ten minutes has elapsed since the announcement that exhibits are required for judging, unless they have been unavoidably delayed by previous judging not completed on time, and then only with the special permission of the Show Management.
14. No Modifications will be made to this schedule except by permission of the General Committee of The Kennel Club, which will be followed by advertisement in the Canine Press wherever possible.
15. All exhibitors must be familiar with Kennel Club regulations F (Annex B) regulations for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition.
16. Please make all cheques payable to THE GSD CLUB OF DEVON
17. The Committee will be empowered to exclude or remove any dog, which is not in a fit state for exhibition, either from illness, disease, vice, natural or other cause, and if such exclusion takes place, either before, during or after judging, then entry fees will be forfeited.
18. The Committee will be most anxious for the care and safety of all dogs entered for exhibition and for any property entrusted to it, but it must be clearly understood by exhibitors and any other person, that the Committee will not be responsible for the entire or partial loss, or detention of, or damage to any dog or person for any cause whatsoever, nor for any act or omission of themselves, their officers, servants, agents and others, and it is on this understanding only that entries are received.
19. The committee can accept no responsibility for products advertised or sold by stall holders at the Show, and we wish to remind exhibitors that grooming products on sale may not meet the requirements of the Regulations for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition, (KCSR(F)).
20. Dogs entered at Kennel Club Licensed Obedience Show must be registered at the Kennel Club in accordance with Kennel Club Regulations for Classification and Registration B.
21. Exhibits only are permitted within the precincts of the Show.
22. No person shall carry out punitive correction or harsh handling of a dog at any time within the boundaries of the show.
23. Should a judge be unable to fulfil the appointment to judge the Committee reserves the right to appoint another Judge.
24. No Competitor shall impugn the decision of the Judge/Judges.
25. Should circumstances so dictate, the Society, in consultation with the Judges, may alter arrangements as necessary. Such changes and the circumstances around them must be reported to the Kennel Club.
26. Parents/Guardians are responsible for their children at all times during the Show.

# SHOW REGULATIONS

1. The Show will open at 8.30am
2. Dogs will be received until 12.00 noon after which time no dogs may be received except under exceptional and unforeseen circumstances and by special permission of the Show Management.
3. Judging will commence at 9.30am SHARP
4. Exhibits may be removed from the Show after their Judging has been completed.  
The show will close half an Hour after all Judging has been completed by which time all dogs must be removed.
5. The use of cooking stoves in the proximity of the tenting and benching areas is forbidden except as authorised by Show Management.
6. Amount of Entry Fees: £15/dog/Class
7. Adverts: Full page £10 / Half Page £7.50
8. There is no prize money on offer at this Show and other fees.
9. The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries. All dogs resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete Number before entry to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries without an Authority to Compete Number will be returned to the Exhibitor/Competitor.  
  
Puppies under six calendar months of age on the first day of the show are not eligible for exhibition.
10. The mating of bitches within the precincts of the show is forbidden.
11. Best Puppy in Show  
Where a Best Puppy in Show competition is scheduled the Best Puppy In Show is a puppy which has competed and is unbeaten by any other puppy exhibited at the same show. A puppy is a dog of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the show. Where the Best in Show is a puppy it automatically be Best Puppy in Show respectively. Similarly, if the Reserve Best in Show is a Puppy which has only been beaten by an adult dog it will automatically be Best Puppy in Show respectively. Consequently, the selection of Best Puppy in Show must follow the select of Best in Show respectively. Best Puppy in Show must be selected from puppies which have been judged and which are unbeaten by any other puppy.  
Withdrawal from Other Competition.  
Puppies, which become eligible for Best Puppy in Show maybe withdrawn from all other competition, other than Breed Classes, prior to the Competition for Best Puppy in Show in order to remain unbeaten. A puppy beaten in competition for Best Puppy in Show may subsequently be exhibited in all competition for which it was previously eligible. The dog declared Best Puppy in Show, However, must not compete in any subsequent competition.  
Proviso  
For the purpose of this Regulation, dogs beaten in competition for Stud Dog, Brood Bitch, Progeny, Brace and Team or a Special Award confined to one breed will not be considered to be a beaten dog.
12. Best in Show.  
The dog declared Best in Show is a dog which has competed and is unbeaten by any other dog exhibited at the same show. Best in Show must be selected from the exhibit declared Best of Sex provided they are unbeaten winning dogs. Reserve Best in Show must be selected from the Best Opposite Sex and the Reserve Best of Sex to the exhibit declared Best in Show. The dogs declared Best in Show and Reserve Best in Show must not compete in any subsequent competition.

## DOGS IN CARS ON HOT DAYS

Your dog(s) is/are vulnerable and is AT RISK if left in a vehicle in high temperatures and even on days considered slightly warm. Please take care of your dog(s).

WARNING: If your dog is found to be at risk forcible entry to your vehicle may be necessary without liability for any damage caused.

### PLEASE NOTE:

- That un-entered dog(s) will NOT be allowed within the precincts of the Show
- Not for Competition entries will be accepted on the entry form
- KC REGULATION F (1)17h ON DOUBLE HANDLING, states that “the attraction of exhibits by any method from outside the ring is prohibited”
- Please be advised that this club is obligated to invoke the escalation procedure in relation to Double handling as outlined in KC Rule F (1) 30 (13) if a class has to be abandoned due to breach of KC Rules, there will be no return of entry fees.
- All handlers when exhibiting in the Ring must wear a numbered bib. The bib must be clearly visible. It is the dog owners responsibility to ensure that the bib is returned to the ring steward at the end of each class. Non returned bibs will be charged for at the cost of £10

## DEFINITION OF BREED CLASSES

In the following definitions, a Challenge Certificate includes any Show Award that counts towards the title of Champion under Rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club.

Show Awards issued by the Irish Kennel club, which count towards the Title Champion, shall be five point Green Stars or more.

Wins at Championship shows in breed classes where Challenge Certificates are not on offer shall be counted as wins at Open shows.

In the case of a dog owned in partnership and entered in Members' classes or competing for Members' Specials each partner must at the time of entry be a member of the society.

In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including the seventh day before the date of closing of entries shall be counted when entering for any class i.e. **Friday 18th June 2010**

Wins in Variety Classes do not count for entry in Breed Classes but when entering for Variety Classes, wins in both Breed and Variety Classes must be counted. A first prize does not include a Special Prize of whatever value.

If an exhibitor reports before the judging of a class or classes that a dog has been entered which is ineligible, the exhibitor may choose one of the following options:

**1. Withdrawal**

The dog may be withdrawn from competition subject to conditions of Regulations 9 (j) and 20.

**2. Transfer**

a) If a dog is ineligible for a class or classes as regards its colour, sex, weight or height the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the equivalent class or classes for the correct colour, sex, weight or height and in the event of there being no equivalent class, Minor Puppy and Puppy excepted to the Open class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.

b) For an exhibit entered incorrectly in a Minor Puppy class or Puppy class or Junior class, which is over age but under 12 calendar months of age, 18 calendar months of age or 24 calendar months of age respectively, the Show Secretary shall transfer the exhibit to the Puppy class, Junior class or Yearling class respectively for the correct colour, sex, weight or height and in the event there being no Puppy, Junior or Yearling class to the Open class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.

c) For any reason other than above, the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the Open class for correct colour, sex, weight or height.

d) If an exhibit arrives late and misses a class, even if it is the only class in which the dog is entered, the dog may not be transferred to any other class.

## BREED CLASSIFICATION:

**MINOR PUPPY**—For dogs of six months and not exceeding nine calendar months of age on the first day of the Show

**PUPPY**—For dogs of six and not exceeding 12 calendar months on the first day of the Show

**JUNIOR**—For dogs of six and not exceeding 18 calendar months on the first day of the Show

**YEARLING**—For dogs of six and not exceeding 24 calendar months on the first day of the Show.

**POST GRADUATE**—For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or five or more first prizes at Championship shows in Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open classes, whether restricted or not

**LIMIT**—For dogs which have not won 3 or more Challenge Certificates under three different Judges, or 7 or more 1st Prizes in all at Championship Shows in Limit or Open Classes, confined to the breed, whether restricted or not, at shows where CCs were offered for the breed

**OPEN**—For all dogs of the breed for which the class is provided and eligible for entry at the show.

**NOT FOR COMPETITION**—Any breed aged over 4 calendar months of age and must be Kennel Club registered. Full details **MUST** be entered on the Entry Form



## Kennel Club Breeders Competition 2010

The Breeders' Competition offers the following Awards:

**Best Breeder in Breed**

**Best Breeder in AVNSC Classes**

**Best Breeder in Group 1st, 2nd, 3rd and 4th**

**Grand Final at DFS Crufts 2011**

The following requirements apply to entries for these awards

1. Breeders wishing to enter the competition should first purchase a Breeders Competition Record Book from the Kennel Club or from the show secretary
2. The Breeder enters for the award in his/her name and is responsible for arranging which exhibits form their breeder group, or team.
3. The Breeder must complete the Record Book accurately with all necessary details before presenting it to the show organisers.
4. The Breeder is responsible for obtaining the necessary authority to compete from the show organisers (or designated official such as the Ring Steward) to compete for the award.
5. The Breeder's team must comprise four exhibits of the same breed, all of which must be entered in a class at the show.
6. A Breeder may enter more than one team per show.
7. All dogs must have the same registered breeder.
8. The "beaten dog" rule will NOT apply.
9. Best Breeder in Breed and Best Breeder in AVNSC Classes goes through to a Best Breeder in Group Award.
10. Breeders acquire points in competition over a calendar year as follows:-

Breed Win	1 Point
Win in AVNSC Classes	1 Point
Fourth in Group	1 Point
Third in Group	2 Points
Second in Group	3 Points
First in Group	4 Points

The thirty Breeders who have amassed the highest number of points over a calendar year will qualify for the DFS Crufts Final in the following year. At the end of the competition year in question Breeders should forward their record books to the Canine Activities Department at the Kennel Club with will advise whether they have qualified for the DFS Crufts Final.
